Timings of the School Day

8.40am – Gates will open and children can walk straight to class.

8.50am – Register and start of the school day (please ensure your children are in class by this time).

If your child arrives after this time, it is essential that you walk them to the school office to sign them in safely **giving a reason for the lateness for our records.**

8.50am – Gates will be closed. If you arrive after this time, you will need to buzz the intercom.

3.30pm – Each class will be brought to the top playground, so please collect your child from there.



Punctuality

If your child arrives after 8:50am, it is essential that you walk them to the school office to sign them in safely giving a reason for the lateness for our records.

Being late for school is disruptive for the class and your child.

If you are finding it difficult to get to school on time, please let us know and we will work together to find a positive way forward.

If your child arrives after 9:15am this has to be recorded as unauthorised absence.

In line with government policy, 10 sessions of unauthorised absence may result in a fine.



Uniform & Equipment

We want the children at our school to feel smart and proud of their uniform. The correct uniform must be worn **every day** unless it is an a PE day or an arranged dress-up day or non school uniform day.

-  Grey or black trousers/shorts/skirt/dress
-  White polo shirt
-  Red sweatshirt or cardigan
-  Red and white checked/striped summer dress
-  Grey, black or white socks / tights
-  Plain Black shoes/trainers
-  Long hair tied up
-  If ears are pierced, studs are permitted however no other jewellery is to be worn
-  Watches (Smart watches must be handed in at the office each day.)

Please make sure all items are clearly and permanently named.

Please also let us know if you do not want us to write your child's name in the label.

Equipment

-  Pencil cases are not needed, as the children have all stationery needed provided for them
-  Please do not bring in toys from home. These can be a source of distraction and upset.
-  Sensory items. These are permitted for children who need them. This must be discussed with your class teacher and Mrs Bordoli before being brought into school.

Wellies

- 🌱 We all have welly stands for our class.

- 🌱 If your child has them in school all the time, this make it easier for us to be spontaneous.

PE



- ❖ We will have two PE slots each week.
- ❖ These will be on **Tuesday and Wednesday.**
- ❖ **This reduces to one slot if we have forest school.**
- ❖ It is really important that your child comes in to school in their PE uniform on these days.

All items must be clearly named, including:

- House coloured T-shirt - with or without embroidered logo
 - Plain Black sports shorts – not cycling shorts
 - Plain Black jogging trousers or black leggings for colder weather (no logo)
 - Trainers – plain coloured
 - School jumper or cardigan
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- ❖ All PE uniform should be plain without brand logos.

Forest School and Edible Playground

Tuesday Afternoons

-  This area of learning is really important to us as a school.
-  In order to experience different seasons, classes will have two blocks of 3 weeks at different times of the year rather than one block of six weeks.
-  During a session, each class will be split into two groups and will rotate between Edible Playground and forest school

Trips and Enrichment contribution

Voluntary Contributions

- Our school budget is based on a few factors such as the number of pupils in school. We carefully plan each year what the money will be spent on.
- The vast majority of this goes on teachers, teaching assistants, staff and essential resources.
- Our trips are linked closely to the curriculum and are an valuable enrichment.
- Without the voluntary contributions – we simply cannot afford to offer them.

How is the cost worked out

- Where possible we ask St Swithun's to help us with mini busses.
- Where they cannot help, we source different coach quotes and go for the cheapest.
- We look at peak times for venues and go for the cheapest times
- We try to offer local trips that are free
- We divide the costs equally across the class.
- Legally, we are not allowed to make a profit or factor in non payment.
- This year we have over £810 outstanding payments for trips.

Homework, Reading and Times Tables



-  Our half termly overviews contain project home learning ideas.
-  You and your child can choose which of these to complete. They can be brought into school to share with the class.
-  The children have a Reading Record to record their daily reading. We expect the children to read five times a week.
-  Your child will have access to Spelling Shed and Numbots / TTRS. We encourage you to log on weekly and practise these vital skills.
-  Teachers may occasionally set additional home learning on a particular topic or subject. This will be communicated by email.

Snacks

The following snacks are permitted:

- ❖ a bread roll
- ❖ bread sticks, plain crackers
- ❖ unprocessed, raw fruit and vegetables

Please provide your child with a named water bottle each day. We do try to have cups to offer the children a drink, but it is really important that they **bring their named water bottle with them every day.**

Please send children in with water only (no squash or fizzy drinks please).



Learning Behaviours



Celebrating Success

We encourage the children to feel proud of their hard work and positive attitudes. Our ethos teaches the children to respect one another and themselves as well as celebrating our differences.

-  Bronze, Silver, Gold and Head Teacher awards and certificates are celebrated in a weekly assembly. These certificates are given out throughout the year for excellent pieces of work and learning behaviours.
-  House points / house celebrations for the winning house each term
-  Recognition for being Ready, Respectful & Safe awards celebrated in a weekly assembly
-  Postcards home from Head Teacher and Head Teacher's award

Reading to your children at home

-  Reading to your children at home is crucial throughout primary school.
-  Reading books to your children that they might not be able to access independently promotes comprehension of new vocabulary.
-  It also encourages discussion around texts that mirrors what we do in school around inference and deduction.
-  Reading to your children can be beneficial through promoting an interest and enjoyment of reading.
-  It can also help to close any reading gap that may exist and give your child more opportunities as they move up through education.

Hearing your child read at home

-  Any sort of reading – fiction, non-fiction, comics – will be beneficial
-  5-10 minutes per day will build confidence and increase fluency.
-  Shared reading (taking it in turns to read), can be a useful technique for children who are reluctant to read at home.
-  Talk to their child about what the subtext is, to encourage inference and deduction.
-  Explore unknown vocabulary through the use of similar words to explain.
-  Record your home reading in your reading record.

We complete our own formative and summative teacher assessments throughout the school year. This helps to inform both our planning and any conversations we will have with you.

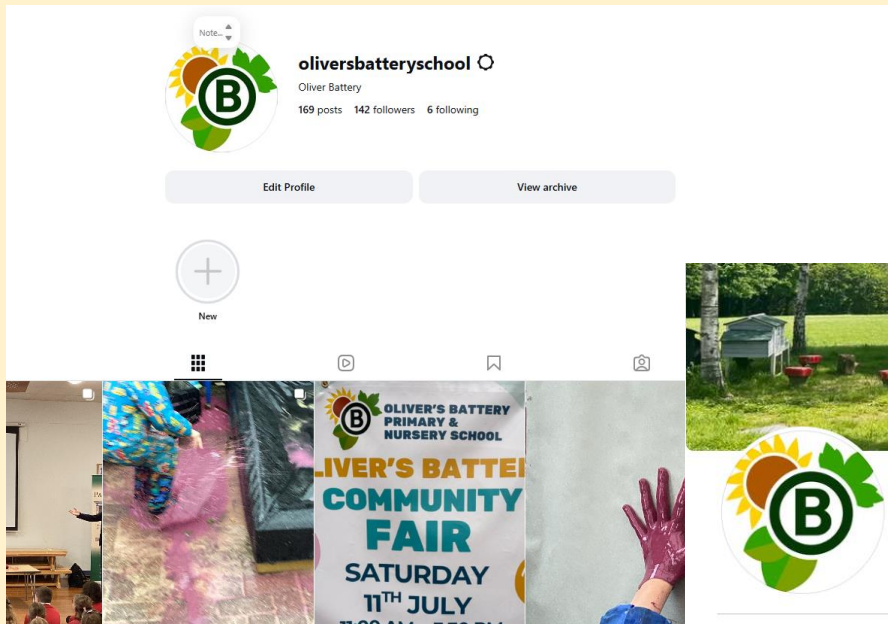
How to Contact Us
